# **PM NARENDRA MODI HONORED WITH FIRST-EVER PHILIP KOTLER PRESIDENTIAL AWARD**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi became the first recipient of the prestigious Philip Kotler Presidential award.

The award focuses on the triple bottom-line of 'People, Profit and Planet' which will be offered annually to the leader of a nation. According to the citation of the award, Modi was selected for his "outstanding leadership for the nation.

His selfless service towards India, combined with his tireless energy has resulted in extraordinary economic, social and technological advances in the country. The citation further added that under Modi's leadership, India is now identified as the centre for innovation and value added manufacturing (Make in India), as well as a global hub for professional services such as information technology, accounting and finance.

The citation also mentions: "His visionary leadership has also resulted in the Digital Revolution (Digital India), including the Unique Identification Number, Aadhaar, for social benefits and financial inclusion. It is enabling entrepreneurship, ease of doing business, and creating a 21st century infrastructure for India."

## **DD SCIENCE AND INDIA SCIENCE CHANNEL LAUNCHED**

The Department of Science and Technology and public broadcaster Doordarshan launched two science channels-- DD Science and India Science.

Speaking at the launch of the free-to-air channels, Science and Technology Minister Harsh Vardhan said developing a scientific temperament was a "critical necessity" and the ultimate aim was to launch a 24/7 channel dedicated to science.

The channels will have science-based documentaries, studio-based discussions, virtual walkthroughs of scientific institutions, interviews and short films and will be completely free to access. Doordarshan reaches over three crore houses in the country and would be an impactful medium for the popularisation of science.

## **SATYARUP SIDDHANTA BECOMES WORLD'S YOUNGEST TO CLIMB 7 HIGHEST VOLCANOES, 7 HIGHEST MOUNTAINS IN 7 CONTINENTS**

Kolkata mountaineer Satyarup Siddhanta reached the peak of Antarctica's highest point, the 4,285m Mount Sidley and became the world's youngest person to climb the seven highest peaks and the seven highest volcanic summits across the seven continents of the world in seven years. He is also the first person in India to conquer the seven mountain peaks and seven volcanic summits.

Satyarup summited Mt. Sidley at 6:28 IST, at a temperature of minus 40 degree Celsius, according to the inReach Satellite Communicator he was carrying. He was the first Indian to climb Mt. Sidley.

The Kolkata software engineer achieved the feat at the age of 35 years and 262 days, while Australia's Daniel Bull did it aged 36 years 157 days as per the Guinness Book of World Records.

This achievement by him has made him the fifth Indian citizen to have climbed the tallest peaks in each continent.

# IIT HYDERABAD LAUNCHES B.TECH COURSE IN ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE

The Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Hyderabad will launch a full-fledged B Tech program in Artificial Intelligence (AI) from the coming academic year (2019-2020). With this, the institute claims it has become the first Indian educational institution to offer a full-fledged B Tech programme in AI. IIT-Hyderabad is also the third institute globally after US-based Carnegie Mellon University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT).

Taught by the department of AI, IIT-Hyderabad, the course syllabus will comprise of the study of algorithms from the computer science department, signal processing from the electrical engineering department, robotics from mechanical engineering department and mathematical foundations.

The course will also focus on application verticals such as healthcare, agriculture, smart mobility, among many others.



### **INGREDIENTS OF PAPAD CHAAT :**

6 PAPAD

1 CUP FINELY CHOPPED ONION

1 CUP DICED,PEELED CUCUMBER

2 TABLESPOON LEMON JUICE

2 FINELY CHOPPED GREEN CHILLI

2 BOILED,DICED,PEELED POTATO

1 CUP FINELY CHOPPED TOMATO

1/3 CUP ROASTED CRUSHED

PEANUTS

2 TABLESPOON CHAAT MASALA

POWDER

3 SPRIGS FINELY CHOPPED

CORIANDER LEAVES

### **HOW TO MAKE PAPAD CHAAT :**

#### STEP 1

ROAST PAPAD ON AN OPEN FLAME OR IN A MICROWAVE OVEN AND CRUSH INTO SMALL PIECES.

#### STEP 2

IN A LARGE BOWL, COMBINE POTATOES, ONIONS, TOMATOES, CUCUMBER, PEANUTS AND CASHEW NUTS. MIX THOROUGHLY. ADD CHAAT MASALA, LIME JUICE AND GREEN CHILI AND TOSS GENTLY.

#### STEP 3

FINALLY, ADD THE ROASTED AND CRUSHED PAPAD TO THE VEGETABLES AND STIR WELL. SERVE THIS IMMEDIATELY OR ELSE THE PAPAD WILL GRADUALLY GET SOGGY.

#### STEP 4

ALTERNATIVELY TOSS ALL THE SALAD INGREDIENTS TOGETHER AND KEEP IT IN THE REFRIGERATOR. ONCE CHILLED, ADD THE CRUSHED PAPAD, TOSS AND SERVE IMMEDIATELY. (SPROUTED MOONG DAL CAN ALSO BE ADDED TO THE CHAAT TO MAKE IT HEALTHIER.)

PAPAD CHAAT IS AN INDIAN SNACK RECIPE MADE BY TOPPING ROASTED PAPAD WITH A MIXTURE OF ROASTED PEANUTS, CHAAT MASALA, LEMON JUICE AND VEGETABLES LIKE ONIONS, POTATOES AND TOMATOES. IT IS VERY EASY TO MAKE AND IDEAL TO SERVE BEFORE DINNERS OR WITH EVENING TEA.
